



PODCAST POLICY

City Park Radio has a podcast link on the website for selected segments and programs broadcast by City Park Radio.

They will be of interest to our local community

Be broadcast, or be able to be broadcast, by City Park Radio

Preference given to material of specific relevance to our licenced broadcast area.

Preference given to material that is non-time specific.

Preference given to material produced locally by City Park Radio or in conjunction with, or in partnership with, local community groups or other local community members.

All local programs (live or recorded) presented on City Park Radio are the property of City Park Radio.

City Park Radio exercises copyright on those recordings. (excludes network programs).

All presenters/producers have acknowledged the ownership of their programs rest with City Park Radio. (Presenters sign that acknowledgement with their volunteer application and later, after training, the presenter's agreement).

City Park Radio will hold appropriate APRA/AMCOS/PPCA licences for audio on demand (podcasts).

City Park Radio is aware of the limitation imposed by the PPCA for the use of live & commercially available recorded music, particularly in music only programs.

Presenters/Producers must seek Management approval to use any City Park Radio material on third party platforms such as Twitch, YouTube, Mixcloud etc. Proponents must accept all responsibility, liability and meet any legislative requirements for their posts on third party sites.

For Community Podcasters - as part of our commitment to community engagement, City Park Radio will work with participants who -

1. Agree to credit City Park Radio on each episode.
2. Offer City Park Radio unilateral rights to...
 - a..... Broadcast on our terrestrial services
 - b.... provide a podcast link on our website

Our volunteers and local community Podcasters can negotiate the use of our podcast studio.

They can negotiate with City Park Radio to jointly apply for grant funding if their project is for City Park Radio and possibly be offered to and syndicated at a later stage on Community Radio across Australia (CRN).
